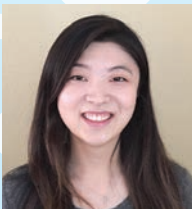

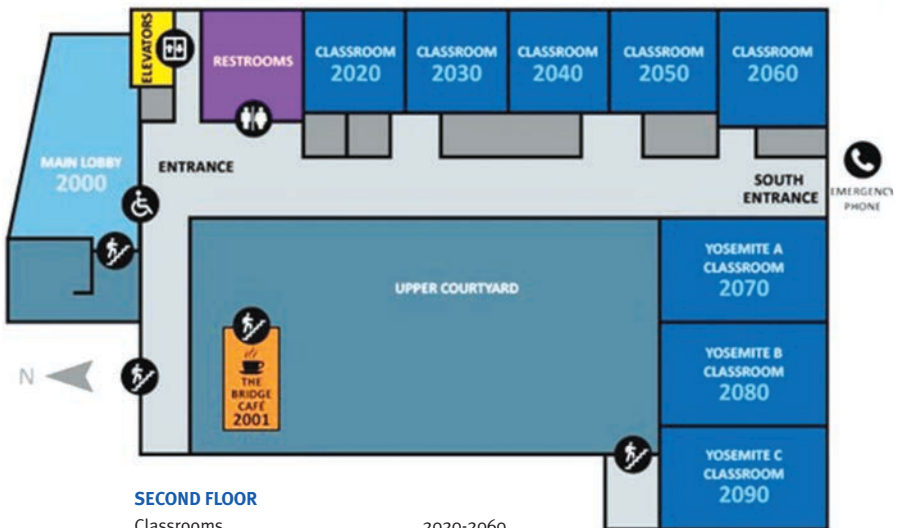

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Insang Hwang: Deputy Consul General of the Republic of Korea in Los Angeles

Deputy Consul General Insang Hwang has held his position at the Korean Consulate General in Los Angeles since August 2017. Prior to his current post, he served as a Counsellor at the Korean Mission to the European Union (2014) in Brussels and as Senior Consul at the Korean Consulate General to Shanghai (2011). Deputy Consul General Hwang first joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) in 1995, and subsequently served as the Deputy Director of the North American & European Union Trade Division (2009) and Director of FTA Policy Planning Division (2010) at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MOFAT). Graduating from Seoul National University in 1993, he went on to study at the Graduate School of International Relations & Pacific Studies at the University of California in San Diego (1998) and earn a Law Master degree (L.M.) from the Graduate School of Legal Studies at Korea University (2011). Focusing on economic affairs, Deputy Consul Hwang has participated in negotiating integral trade agreements including the KORUS-FTA, Korea-EU FTA, and Korea-China FTA over the course of his diplomatic career.

Jerry Kang: Vice Chancellor for Equity, Diversity and Inclusion, Professor of Law, UCLA

Jerry Kang is Professor of Law, Professor of Asian American Studies, the inaugural Korea Times Endowed Chair, and UCLA's inaugural Vice Chancellor for Equity, Diversity and Inclusion. A leading scholar on implicit bias and the law, Prof. Kang has published more than a dozen articles on the subject in leading journals including the *Harvard Law Review*. He regularly collaborates with leading experimental social psychologists on wide-ranging scholarly, educational, and advocacy projects.

Recognized by both the UCLA law school and the university with multiple teaching awards, Prof. Kang is widely sought after as a speaker. Prof. Kang graduated *magna cum laude* from both Harvard University (physics) and Harvard Law School, where he was a supervising editor of the *Harvard Law Review*. After clerking for the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, he started his teaching career at UCLA in 1995 and has visited at Georgetown, Harvard, and NYU law schools.



Young Kim: Former CA State Assemblywoman

Young Kim’s public service began more than 25 years ago, when she began to work for U.S. Representative Ed Royce, serving as his key liaison in the communities and eventually becoming his Director of Asian Affairs. In addition, Kim earned a reputation for being a popular television talk show host with her weekly program on KSCI-LA 18, LA Seoul (1997-2005), and on Arirang-TV’s Real Talk (2011). Currently, she is hosting a weekly program called “KBS America Talk Show: Issues and Empathy.”

Continuing to expand her public service, Kim was elected to the 65th California State Assembly District in 2014. Despite long odds, she unseated a fully funded incumbent to become the first ever Korean-American woman elected to serve in the State Assembly. As Assemblywoman, Kim promoted popular policy objectives in our state government such as fiscal restraint of tax spending, education reform, and spurring economic opportunities. Additionally, Kim was successful in securing millions of dollars to help homeless youth and veterans, introduced legislation to build a veterans hospital in Orange County, and championed a measure to protect victims of domestic violence with her bill (AB 2078) that passed with bipartisan support.

L. Song Richardson: Interim Dean, Professor of Law, UC Irvine School of Law

L. Song Richardson is the Interim Dean and Professor of Law at the University of California, Irvine School of Law, with a joint appointment in the Department of Criminology, Law and Society. She received her AB from Harvard University and her JD from Yale Law School. Her interdisciplinary research uses lessons from cognitive and social psychology, decision-making and judgment in a variety of contexts, and she is a leading expert on implicit racial and gender bias. Her scholarship has been published by law journals at Yale, Cornell, Duke and Northwestern, among others. Currently, she is working on a book that examines the legal and moral implications of mind sciences research on policing and criminal procedure. She is a member of the American Law Institute.

Dean Richardson’s legal career has included a partnership at a boutique criminal law firm and work as a state and federal public defender in Seattle, Washington. She was also an Assistant Counsel at the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc. Immediately upon graduation from law school, Professor Richardson was a Skadden Arps Public Interest Fellow with the National Immigration Law Center in Los Angeles and the Legal Aid Society’s Immigration Unit in Brooklyn, NY.



Michael Yang: Founder and CEO, Michael Yang Capital Management LLC

Michael Yang is the Founder & CEO of Michael Yang Capital Management, LLC, an asset management company focused on technology investments. He has over 30 years of experience in the technology industry in Silicon Valley. He currently serves as a director on the board of Hanmi Bank (NASDAQ: HAFB). Mr. Yang was a Co-Founder and CEO of three Silicon Valley technology start-ups that were sold to larger enterprises, including mySimon.com which raised \$30 million in venture capital and was subsequently acquired by CNET for \$700 million.

Mr. Yang received his BS degree in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science from UC Berkeley, an MS degree in Computer Science from Columbia University, and an MBA degree from the Haas School of Business at UC Berkeley. He has served on the advisory board of the Stanford Institute of Economic Policy Research (SIEPR) at Stanford University as well as on the IT Advisory Council for President George W. Bush. Mr. Yang is a Co-Founder & Founding Chairman of the Council of Korean Americans (CKA), and also serves as a Director and as the Treasurer of the La Cañada Flintridge Education Foundation.

Summer Kim: Assistant Professor of Law, UC Irvine School of Law

Professor Summer Kim’s primary interests are in corporate law, corporate finance, financial regulation, and contracts. Her scholarship examines how financial innovations outpace governing laws and regulations, and her work aims to close these gaps. Her recent research projects have focused on the regulation of leveraged loans and the private equity model of corporate ownership.

Professor Kim received her J.D. from Harvard Law School and her B.A. in Economics, summa cum laude, from Seoul National University.

Michelle Rhyu: Partner, Cooley LLP

Judge Kim grew up in Los Angeles before earning her BA at Cornell University and JD from Columbia University.

Angie Kang: Vice President of Business and Legal Affairs, Hulu

After graduating from UC Berkeley School of Law, Angie Kang began her legal career in the corporate department of Latham & Watkins in 2008. 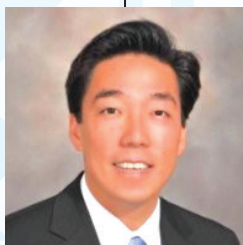
MEDICINE PANEL



John S. Yu: Professor and Director, Brain Tumor Center, Cedars-Sinai Medical Center

John S. Yu is the Medical Director of the Brain Tumor Center and Professor and Vice Chair in the Department of Neurosurgery at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. He is conducting research in immune and stem cell therapy for brain tumors.

Dr. Yu earned his bachelor's degree from Stanford University and spent a year at the Sorbonne in Paris studying French literature. He completed his fellowship in immunology at the Institut Pasteur in Paris. He earned his medical degree from Harvard Medical School and master's degree from the Harvard University Department of Genetics. He completed his neurosurgical residency at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. Dr. Yu is chairman and founder of Kairos Pharma, a development stage biotechnology company focused on immunotherapy and nanotechnology.



Jinha Park: Founder and CEO, eRadPath, Inc.

Dr. Jinha Park is the past president of the California Radiological Society. Dr. Park is active in the largest state chapter of the American College of Radiology as well as in the California Medical Association, working to improve access to imaging screening tests and increase the role of diagnostic and interventional radiology. He is a District 14 president, board member, and executive committee member of the Los Angeles County Medical Association. He has served as the Orange County Supervisor District 2 Representative for Michelle Park Steel on the Orange County Emergency Medical Care Committee. Dr. Park also serves on the inaugural Buena Park Police Chief's Advisory Committee. He has served on past Board of Directors of the Korean American Coalition and Korean Churches for Community, and is the earliest sponsor and Organizing Chair of the Korean American Health Coalition.

Dr. Park obtained his BA in Molecular and Cell Biology graduating Phi Beta Kappa from the University of California, Berkeley. He then completed both his MD and PhD at the University of Southern California, studying a specific tumor associated protein called HER-2 in breast and stomach cancer, and developing an antibody against this cancer protein for future diagnostic and therapeutic purposes. After completing his internship at Kaiser Permanente Los Angeles Medical Center, he then completed his residency in Diagnostic Radiology at UCLA Medical Center and a Fellowship in Abdominal Cancer Imaging at Stanford University Medical Center. Dr. Park is currently working to develop a digital health start-up company that empowers patients with their own diagnostic test results.



Yanghee Woo: Associate Professor, Division of Surgical Oncology, City of Hope

Yanghee Woo is an accomplished surgeon scientist internationally recognized for her expertise in robotic surgery and gastric cancer. She graduated from Princeton University with a BA in Political Science and certificate in East Asian studies. After receiving her MD from Drexel College of Medicine, she completed a research fellowship at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, surgical residency at Columbia University Medical Center (CUMC) and a clinical fellowship at Severance Hospital/Yonsei University, Seoul, S. Korea. Dr. Woo was recruited to City of Hope after 4 years on faculty at CUMC where she started the first gastric/pancreas cancer robotics program.

At City of Hope, Dr. Woo is an Associate Professor of Surgery, Vice Chair of International Affairs, and the Director of Minimally Invasive Therapies program in the Division of Surgical Oncology and Department of Surgery. As a translational member of the Fong/Chen research team, she works to bring novel oncolytic viral therapies to treat patients with advanced stage cancers. She also researches molecular biomarkers of early cancer detection in high-risk populations.

With a passion for eliminating the cancer disparities that disproportionately impact minorities in the United States, Dr. Woo is an outspoken advocate for improving the health of the Korean American community. She currently serves as the president of the Korean American Graduate Medical Association and was the Chair of the Scientific Program Committee of the 2nd Korean American Health Conference.

David S. Kim: Assistant Residency Program Director, Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology, Cedars-Sinai Medical Center

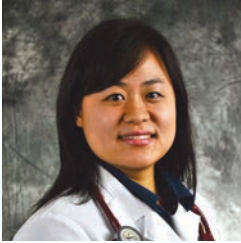

Kim is the assistant director for the Obstetrics and Gynecology Residency Program in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, an Associate Clinical Professor at The David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA, and adjunct assistant clinical professor at the USC Keck School of Medicine.

Dr. Kim received his BS in Biochemistry from the University of California, San Diego. He then received his MD from the State University of New York Health Science Center at Brooklyn, NY. Dr. Kim completed his residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at The George Washington University, Washington, DC and advanced his training with a Master's and PhD in Clinical Research and MBA from the University of Hawaii.

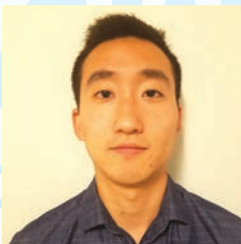
Esther Yoon: Family Medicine Doctor, Esther Yoon MD, Inc.

Dr. Esther Yoon is Board Certified in Family Medicine and is a Diplomate of the American Board of Family Medicine. Dr. Yoon specializes in family medicine primary care for adults, pediatrics, women's health and geriatrics. She currently practices in Glendale, California.

Dr. Yoon is a graduate of the USC Keck School of Medicine and received her undergraduate degree from the University of California, Berkeley. She completed her residency training at one of the premier family medicine residencies in the nation, Ventura County Medical Center in Ventura, California. Sylvia Kim: Orange County Regional Director, Asian Americans Advancing Justice

Sylvia Kim is Asian Americans Advancing Justice-LA’s Orange County Regional Director. Ms. Kim provides vision and strategic leadership for the organization’s work and is responsible for securing resources to sustain and expand the Orange County Regional office.

Prior to joining Advancing Justice, Ms. Kim was the executive director of a multi-ethnic collaborative advocating to reduce racial disparities in accessing mental health. She currently sits on the Steering Committee for the California-wide Racial and Ethnic Mental Health Disparities Coalition and is a member of the California Office of Health Equity Advisory Committee. Originally from Toronto, Canada, she co-founded Canada’s largest human rights organization for North Korean human rights.

Ms. Kim earned her JD from Osgoode Hall Law School in Toronto and completed her Master of Studies in International Human Rights Law

(LL.M. equivalent) at Oxford University. After law school, she practiced criminal law as both a defense attorney and as an Assistant Crown Attorney. Ms. Kim then went on to non-profit community-based work managing public legal education programs and training sessions on access to justice issues. Ms. Kim moved to Orange County, California in late 2013 and is a regular contributor to the Huffington Post.



Joon Bang: Executive Director, Korean American Coalition, Los Angeles

Joon Y. Bang is the executive director of the Korean American Coalition-Los Angeles (KAC-LA), a 2017 California Non-Profit of the Year Honoree. After graduating from Biola University, Mr. Bang interned with the National Conference of State Legislatures in Washington D.C., contributed to several published reports on immigration, and spearheaded publication on the Human Services federal budget update in 2006. His career in social justice work began with the NAACP Legal Defense Fund (LDF) where he served as the primary program manager in the national office. He led multiple programs including the historic Civil Rights Training Institute and oversaw the organization's strategic planning and special projects.

After LDF, Mr. Bang joined the UCLA Foundation as its associate director to help advance the philanthropic pillar of the organization by partnering with the organization's board of directors and was responsible for creating the Foundation's \$500,000 scholarship fund to support low-income students. Mr. Bang currently serves on the steering committee of the United States Census Bureau CIC and advisory board of Divided Families USA.



Lisa Kim: Deputy Attorney General, Privacy Enforcement and Protection Unit of the Consumer Law Section, California Department of Justice

Lisa Kim is a Deputy Attorney General in the Privacy Enforcement and Protection Unit of the Consumer Law Section at the California Department of Justice. She enforces state and federal privacy laws, educates Californians on their rights and strategies for protecting their privacy, encourages businesses to follow privacy-respectful best practices, and advises the Attorney General on privacy matters. Prior to joining the Attorney General's office, she was a litigator at Reed Smith LLP in the areas of complex business litigation, data privacy, class action defense, legal malpractice, and products liability. Ms. Kim earned her BA *magna cum laude* from UCLA and her JD from University of California, Berkeley School of Law.

Phillip Chang: Founder and CEO, Yogurtland

Thirty years ago, Phillip Chang immigrated to the U.S. He began working in IT and later started his own IT consulting business, igniting his entrepreneurial interest. In 2001, he opened his first retail business specializing in teas and boba. Later, Mr. Chang expanded the concept to include frozen yogurt and added a topping bar allowing guests to customize their own dessert. He renamed the shop Yogurtland, and it has reshaped the popular frozen yogurt trend. Now celebrating 10 years in business, Yogurtland is the front-runner in the frozen yogurt segment, operating or franchising more than 300 locations across the United States and in Australia, Singapore, Dubai, Venezuela, Guam and Thailand.

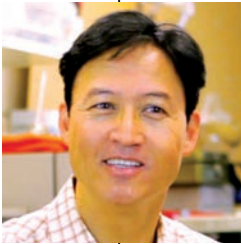
